




After heartbreaks in 2005 and 2017, Harmanpreet Kaur's side produced a complete performance to lift their Women's Cricket World Cup title, also becoming the first women's team from Asia to win a global title across formats.

Smriti Mandhana gives the team strong and steady starts as an opener. Her elegant stroke play builds momentum and puts pressure on the bowlers early in the Match.

Harmanpreet Kaur as captain, she leads with confidence. She is known for powerful batting in big matches and guides the team during tough situations

Jemimah Rodrigues brings stability in the middle order. Her smart shot selection and quick running between wickets help maintain the team's scoring rate.

INDIAN WOMEN IN BLUE

Team India contributes as one united unit rather than depending on a single player. The batters build strong partnerships and handle pressure calmly. The bowlers work together to control runs and take key wickets at crucial moments. The fielders bring energy, saving important runs and creating chances through sharp catches and quick throws. 



TRAILBLAZER IN FIELD OF FEMALE CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS

PROLOGUE TO A MASSIVE CHAPTER:

As of 2024-25 estimates, over 90,000+ of the total 3 lakh+ ICAI members are women, representing approximately 30% of the total membership in India. The present scenario has a beginning, CA.R.Sivabogam is the name of such initiation who is known to be the first female Chartered Accountant. She spent a year in the jail to go against society. Not just to tally balance sheets but tally the accounts of all those people out there who told women can't. But the life of a woman in a chartered accountancy profession hasn't been the same throughout. Let me tell you a story. Let me take you back in the time when things weren't the same.

DREAMS DURING DECLINING AUTONOMY:

People around used to say women don't belong to boardrooms. They belong to kitchen. One lady out there wanted to break the shackles to make life simpler and make life the way it is today for a lot of women out there. She was fighting for freedom not just of Hers' but also for our country. She joined the movement started by Mahatma Gandhi. The protest for freedom took her to jail and she found her love for the subject of accounting there.

She spent a year in jail. The day she came out she decided to pursue what was called back then as the government's diploma of accounting, which is modern day Chartered Accountancy course. Not just today, but time back then as well, this was one of the toughest courses to crack. Though she cracked the examination, she needed to complete the practical training. No one was ready to accept a woman as a trainee in their office.



Adding on to that was the fact that she was in jail in the freedom movement. She had to find someone who were willing to share their knowledge and go against the society to let a woman get trained under them. She finished her training, gave the final level of examination, cleared one of the most difficult examinations in the country only to see the fact that the British government is not letting her practice the degree what she gave her entire life for just one reason that she was jailed. She didn't accept defeat, never was she willing to. She fought hard.

FRUITS OF LABOR:

She came out victorious against the British government, letting her practice her degree of chartered accountancy. She started her own firm, started practicing accounting, not just to tally balance sheets, but tally the accounts of all those people out there who told women can't. Not just to find profit in that painful statement but also to find a little hope in a girl's life out there to tell her that she can. She went on to become the first woman Chartered Accountant R. Sivabogam who was instrumental in floating our mother Institute of Chartered Accountants of India post-independence in 1949 and she went on, to become chairman of SIRC for three consecutive years.

TAKEAWAY FROM THE TRIBUTE

For all of you out there, we don't really have to face the kind of difficulties what she had to. She's laid the path down for us to walk really soothing and reach our dreams much earlier. And we here today have to take inspiration from her to make unbelievable things happen. Break the shackles in the society, make things mirror and go achieve our dreams. JAI HIND!




Becoming a Chartered Accountant is not an ordinary dream. The Chartered Accountancy Course curriculum is designed to test not just your knowledge, but your patience, discipline, and resilience. If you are on this path, you are already courageous. And if you have come this far, you are already halfway there!

I began my CA journey right after school, enrolling in the CA Foundation course while simultaneously pursuing my B. Com degree. The initial stages Foundation and Intermediate went smoothly. I cleared them on my first attempts and completed my Intermediate by the end of my second year of college. I waited a year to finish graduation and then began my articleship.

Life, however, had its own plans.

I got married. By the time I became eligible to appear for CA Final, I was expecting my child. I still attempted the exams, determined to push through. But after my first paper, I broke down. I realized that my preparation required more time and, more importantly, that I needed to be honest with myself regarding my priorities.





Thanks to the almighty for giving me the courage to pause
and strength to continue!

I chose to pause and focus on one responsibility at a time.

After my child turned two, I resumed my studies. But returning to
studies was far way harder than I thought it would be. It took
nearly two years just to regain the rhythm and confidence of
studying. There were self-doubts, exhaustion, and moments when
I questioned everything.

I took four attempts to clear Group 1 and I cleared Group 2 in my
first attempt. Altogether, it took me nearly a decade to qualify as a
Chartered Accountant and begin my career.

And every single year of that journey was worth it and meaningful.

If there is one thing I have learned, it is this: **Everyone's timeline
is different.** Some finish early. Some take longer. Some juggle
family responsibilities. Some face financial struggles. Some battle
self-doubt. Yet many qualify despite challenges, despite parenting
responsibilities, despite setbacks.

So, when you feel left behind, remind yourself that you are
building something lasting. You are investing in a lifelong career.
You are growing in ways others may not immediately see. Your
sacrifices today are shaping your tomorrow.





